CODE BLUE

- Call 252-847-4333 for Brody *(first floor)* and Vidant buildings.
- Dial 911 for Brody *(second floor and higher)* and all other Health Sciences Campus buildings.
- Refer to the ECU Physicians Code Blue Policy *(C3)*.

FIRE/EVACUATION

- Activate the nearest fire alarm, and call 911.
- Confine the fire/smoke by closing windows and doors.
- Extinguish the fire if you have been trained and it is safe to do so.
- If a fire alarm is activated, evacuation is mandatory— even if you don't smell smoke.
- Follow directions given by your safety representative.
- Do NOT use elevators.
- Assist persons with disabilities to area of rescue assistance.
- Do not reenter the building until authorized by emergency personnel.
- Proceed to your designated meeting location.



ADVERSE WEATHER ADVERSE WEATHER

- For up-to-date information: Monitor local radio and television stations. Visit the ECU Alert website at <u>www.ecu.edu/alert.</u> Call 252-328-0062 (*faculty and staff*). Call 252-744-5080 (*ECU Physicians*).
- Be prepared to shelter in place until you are notified by authorized personnel that it is safe to leave.
- A watch means that severe weather is possible in the watch area.
- A warning means that severe weather has been sighted in the warning area.

THUNDERSTORM

• Do not handle electrical equipment

TORNADO

- Seek shelter immediately!
- Move to an interior room or hallway on a lower floor.
- Stay away from windows.
- Have a way to receive emergency alerts while sheltering

FLOOD

- Do not walk or drive through flowing water or flooded areas
- Stay away from electrical lines

PREPAREDNESS

- Know your area's safety representative and evacuation procedures, including the location of all exits.
- If working with petroleum or hazardous materials, keep spill clean-up supplies nearby.
- Get a battery-operated weather radio and flashlight.
- Discuss preparedness plans with students, staff, and faculty.

- Avoid contact will spill and evacuate building.
- Use emergency showers if exposed to spill.
- If deemed necessary, sound the building fire alarm to evacuate building.

🏠 BOMB THREAT

- Remain calm. Keep the caller on the phone as long as possible.
- Use the Bomb Threat Checklist (*see back*) to gather and record as much information as possible.
- Immediately report the threat to ECU Police *(Health Sciences)* at 252-744-2246 or by calling 911.
- Follow instructions of emergency personnel.

SUSPICIOUS PACKAGE

- Do not touch or disturb the object or package.
- Call ECU Police (Health Sciences) at 252-744-2246 or 911
- Notify your supervisor and/or your safety representative.
- Stay in area until released.

ACTIVE SHOOTER

- Remember RUN.HIDE.FIGHT
- Lock and barricade all doors.
- Turn off lights and close blinds.
- Silence cell phones.
- Take advantage of cover/ protection.
- Remain until "All Clear" is given.
- Monitor <u>www.ecu.edu/alert</u>if safe to do so.
